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MAINTENANCE NEWS

The softball field renovations are nearing completion. While I could bore you with the details, the simplest explanation is to say that we implemented processes to better handle surface water. Clay was removed from the infield and replaced with crushed limestone. An 80/20 sand organic matter mix was applied to the outfield to help raise low lying areas. Both tasks were down with the goal of landing a .5 to 1% grade for watershed. A manhole pit and drain tube were installed north of the softball field to direct runoff from the parking lot to the retention pond. The outlying hillsides were graded down, and new fencing was added to widen the area of safe play. Significant gains have been made, and over time with ongoing maintenance the field will become one of the best natural grass playing surfaces in northern Illinois. Construction season is here! The end of the school year will bring on an onslaught of construction crews for facility upgrades. Three major improvement projects are planned for this summer. The main lobby bathrooms in the high school will undergo a full remodel, while the elementary's library roof and air conditioning condenser for the 4-6 wings will be replaced. Crews will be working onsite from June to August, so please be alert to the surroundings and keep a safe distance.

TECHNOLOGY NEWS

In April, the Technology Department finalized the installation of the display in the Jr/SR High inside concession stand to view games in the gym. By just turning on the power strip and the TV, the games will be displayed so patrons and workers can keep up on the action in the gym while they are working or grabbing a snack. We have had some time this Spring to do some sorting of obsolete equipment that has been gathering dust for several years.

This equipment will be recycled in accordance with local and state ordinances, so it does not go into a landfill and any useful material is reused.
